Private Music Lessons

Tuition and Payment

The 2020-2021 academic year will run from September 9 through June 23. Tuition is charged on a monthly membership model based on your lesson length. All payments are made by automatic credit/debit card or ACH transfer from your bank account on the first of the month or the closest weekday. If you would like to pre-pay for the year, please let Kathy know by emailing info@appletreearts.org.

Should something come up where you can't fulfill your financial commitment, advanced notice and open, ongoing communication is encouraged and appreciated. We will do our best to work with you.

New students may enroll at any time of year and tuition will be prorated to reflect the portion of the year remaining.

Music Membership Plan

To better serve all of our students, we offer an all-inclusive membership plan that allows us to focus on the development of our students as a whole rather than just during the 30/45/60 minutes we see them each week. All the goodies below are included and you never have to worry about one month costing you more than another due to a recital, an extra week, etc. Here's what's included:

✓ **Customized lessons** (see calendar for vacation dates) that cover technique, repertoire or scene study, music theory, music history, diction, and more, depending on your instrument or focus area

✓ Monthly music technology classes

✓ Five performances, workshops, or other **events** led by our fabulous faculty

✓ Access to our **music learning platform** & communication app, which helps motivate students to practice while staying in touch with their teacher(s) and peers

In-Person Lessons by Appointment Only

If you, your teacher, and the Apple Tree Arts staff feel that it is safe to do so, we will allow occasional in-person lessons by appointment only to be held in the Great Hall or in our larger teaching studios. This option will be available to all teachers at their discretion, no more than once per month. Singing and playing wind instruments will not be permitted, and all students and teachers must wear masks at all times. Voice and wind faculty and students are welcome to meet in-person to work on theory, body alignment, or other non-performance-based skills. We will release more details on precautions to be taken once fall lessons have begun. We reserve the right to stop offering in-person appointments at any time for the safety of our students, families, faculty, staff, and community.

Missed Lessons & Cancellations

There are no credits, make ups, or refunds for canceled or missed lessons. This includes cancellations for family vacations, illness, school-related absences, etc. and will be strictly adhered to. Exceptions may be made due to extenuating circumstances. We know that you will likely miss a couple of lessons over the course of the year and we've taken that into account when setting tuition rates. Please note that this cancellation policy is consistent with those of sports teams, schools, camps, etc., all of which place a high priority on regular attendance and diligent commitment.

However, this doesn't mean you have to miss out on the benefit of that week's lesson! Any time you miss a lesson, you can send your teacher a video/audio recording of what you've been working on and a scan/photo of your written work and they'll respond with detailed feedback and an assignment for the week.

Still concerned about missing your lesson? Please be assured that your tuition is always working for you. Our faculty spend an incredible amount of time and money outside of lessons researching new methods and materials, attending workshops, purchasing and selecting repertoire for students, organizing and planning events, creating worksheets and games, and so much more. We guarantee that each student receives much more of our faculty's time than the 30/45/60 minutes they see them each week!

Lesson Swaps

Students who opt-in will receive a schedule and a contact list for their teacher's other students. If you have a one-time conflict, you are welcome to switch lessons with someone else that week. Please let your teacher know of any swaps.

Teacher Cancellations

If your teacher needs to miss a lesson, they will offer you at least 3 options for rescheduling. Please schedule these within 30 days. Make ups not scheduled by the end of the session will be forfeited.

Discontinuing Lessons

Enrolling in lessons reserves your lesson time for the full year from September through June. However, we understand that some students may need to stop taking lessons during that time. The decision to end lessons should be made with careful consideration, with discussion between parent, student, and teacher so that lessons can end positively. 30 days written notice to the ATA business director, Kathy Vandenengel, is required in order to stop tuition payments. If payment has already been received in full, a refund or credit will be issued for the portion of the session remaining after the 30 days notice period.

Media Policy

During lessons, classes, recitals, and other events and performances, Apple Tree Arts reserves the right to use video recording and/or to take photographs of students for use in newsletters, advertising materials, social media, lesson demonstration, YouTube and/or Vimeo, ATA-owned websites, and press releases. If you'd prefer we not share photos or recordings of your child, please notify us in writing. At recitals and events, you are welcome to take photos and videos (and share them with us!), but please refrain from using flash photography during performances and only record your own child. Thank you!

Practice & Parental Support

Young students need a parent/guardian's support and guidance at home to be successful in lessons. At ATA, quality and consistency in practice are emphasized over quantity. Practicing in multiple 15-20 minute chunks of time is often the most effective approach. Speak with your child's teacher for more specific guidance on how much they should be practicing and how to make it an enjoyable experience.

At some point during the course of taking lessons, it's fairly likely that your child will start saying something to the effect of "I don't want to practice" or "I'm too tired to have my lesson." That's normal and even professional musicians and actors have days (or weeks) like that! Please be aware that your child's interest in lessons will naturally ebb and flow, but to be successful, you will need to be consistent in your encouragement and commitment to their artistic education. In most cases, it's a temporary roadblock and will pass or be resolved with open communication. Please keep their teacher in the loop so that they can try to re-inspire them and provide them with some extra encouragement. Setting up regular and effective practice routines at home is paramount - please let your teacher know if you need some helpful suggestions!

Group Classes, Early Childhood, & Ensemble Programs

Tuition and Payment

Tuition for early childhood programs, group classes, & ensembles is charged per program session, as listed on the website. When registering online, payments can be made by automatic credit/debit card or ACH transfer from your bank account. If you would like to pay by check, please let Kathy know by emailing info@appletreearts.org.

If you're having difficulty, feel free to call or email us for help or to add your card/bank information for you.

Should something come up where you can't fulfill your financial commitment, advanced notice and open, ongoing communication is encouraged and appreciated. We will do our best to work with you.

Absences

There are no credits, make ups, or refunds for missed classes or rehearsals. This includes cancellations for family vacations, illness, school-related absences, etc. and will be strictly adhered to. Please note that this cancellation policy is consistent with those of sports teams, schools, camps, etc., all of which place a high priority on regular attendance and diligent commitment.

However, this doesn't mean you have to miss out on the benefit of that week's class! Families in early childhood classes may attend an alternate class time, if available. Students in group classes (such as Piano Partners) may send their teacher a video or audio recording of what they've been working on and will receive detailed feedback and practice suggestions for the week.

Withdrawing from a Program

Enrolling in a group class, ensemble, or early childhood program reserves your spot for the full class session as listed on the website. Families withdrawing prior to the first class of the semester will receive a full refund. Families withdrawing before the fourth week are entitled to a 50% refund of tuition only. (This refund does not include the cost of materials.) After the fourth week, no refunds can be given. Written notice to the ATA business director, Kathy Vandenengel, is required in order to withdraw from a program. If payments are being made in monthly installments, payments will continue automatically until the financial obligation as described above has been fulfilled.

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
